RUBRIC

The evaluation committee will assess each application according to the following rubric. Applicants with the highest scores will receive priority.

APPLICANT MEETS CRITERIA OF GRANT

- Artist, Printer, or otherwise engaged in book arts
- Self-identifies as BIPOC
- Self-identifies as LGBTQ+, person with disabilities, person from lower income background

SELF-REPORTED LEVEL OF FINANCIAL NEED

2 points Low financial need
 5 points Medium financial need
 10 points High financial need

IMPACT OF PROPOSAL ON ARTISTIC/PROFESSIONAL WORK

2 points Small or no impact

4 points Grant would help the applicant on a path that they are

already pursuing

6 points Grant is necessary to achieve something that the

applicant is excited about

8 points Grant would allow a new body of work, or a whole new

audience to engage with that work

DEGREE OF COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT FROM PROPOSAL

1 point Grant would benefit the applicant, but not help get

them or their work out (Buying studio equipment,

materials, etc.)

2 points Grant would help publicize the applicant's work, but not

facilitate direct engagement with the community or an audience (Work documentation, website design, business

cards, etc.)

3 points Grant would facilitate direct engagement with a small

audience, or indirect engagement with a large audience (Attending a workshop, tabling at a smaller, local fair,

startup costs for a new publication, etc.)

4 points Grant would facilitate direct and meaningful

engagement with the larger book arts community (Tabling at a large fair, mounting an exhibition, presenting at a conference, startup costs for offering

workshops, etc.)
